Jesus lives!! Now what? Alleluia!! Christ is risen. The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!! That's how we started our service Easter Day, after the prelude by our organist and brass choir helped

us hear and feel the joy of Easter. And after the children ran (well almost, I was more excited than they, I think) to find the Alleluia banners they had "buried"

on the last Sunday of Epiphany. We raised our voices as we sang our Alleluias again! Then we heard a very familiar story, and maybe we heard it in a new way, or from a different perspective. This year we rejoiced exuberantly with our Choirs, Bells, and with brass, hymns and anthems!! This Easter season we gather as a vibrant community of faith in new ways that deepen our relationships to one another and with God.

We enjoyed saying "alleluia" again. Yet this proclamation of Resurrection and life-everlasting for all has some weightiness, at least for me and maybe for you, too. We are looking forward expectantly and still holding grief at what is gone, has changed and what is yet unknown. For the women at the tomb, this was part of their new story. It's part of our new story as we continue to discover new ways to walk our journey of faith. Our faith lifts us, lightens our burdens, and carries us with each step. The symbols of things past and gone are with us, AND the real presence of God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit feed us with sure and certain hope of things to come.

We are in a time of great change. Let it be for us at St. John's, and individually, a time of transformation. As on that first Easter, God is doing something new. There had been gruesome crucifixions before, but never had the world experienced resurrection. Jesus foretold it to his disciples, and they didn't hear or believe. Still, this new thing happened, and they were amazed. What are the new ways we will do new things to reveal God's love for all creation? How will we deepen and

Let us also take decisive action with our shared vision and strategic action plans. For us the crucified Jesus' resurrection is not only a story about one person. As my friend and bishop of New Hampshire, +Rob Hirschfeld wrote, "The triumph over death, of love over hatred, of hope over fear, is a reality that is communicated to all humankind, indeed all creation, in a community of love." We are changed when we experience Jesus after Easter. By challenging and renewing our community we will share God's abundant love for all.

Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan remind us that the personal and political meanings of the Passion, Crucifixion and Resurrection are captured in two nearly identical questions. The first, "Do you accept Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior? It is a crucially important question, for the Lordship of Christ is the path of personal liberation, return from exile, and conscious reconnection to God. The virtually identical but seldom asked question is: Do you accept Jesus as your political Lord and Savior? The gospel of Jesus, the good news of Jesus, which is the gospel of the kingdom of God, involves both questions." (The Last Week, 2006)

Whose example do you follow? Answering is transformative. This is the story we need to tell, of ours and the world's transformation that is happening always. Like Mary running from her encounter with the risen Jesus to share the good news with the other disciples, we have good news to share. We are changed and transformed. With all the ravages that have been in this time, our faith in God's love and Jesus' presence comfort and strengthen us. In community we reach out to one another sharing love and compassion, prayers, and blessings. We are God's people telling God's story in our lives. We write prayers, our psalms, that recount our hopes and fears, our joys and sorrow. We write and read our own acts of the apostles, our own gospels and epistles. We will continue to proclaim our story of God in our lives, of Jesus walking with us as we look to renew Love in a world trying to tear itself apart with divisions.

We will continue to invite others into this love story with God. Because love wins. Love always wins. We must keep telling the story of God's love for all people and Creation. Peace - Bill+

Camperships Available for Cross Roads Camp - Summer 2024!!!

At the September 2023 meeting, the Vestry approved "camperships" for St. John's children and teens to attend Cross Roads Camp during the summer of 2024. Any current 2nd-12th graders who would like to spend a week at sleep away summer camp at Cross Roads Camp will be eligible for a \$500 campership. Cross Roads Camp and Retreat Center is the Episcopal camp of the Newark Diocese. To be eligible your kids must be registered for St. John's Sunday School or Youth Group and this must be their first time attending Cross Roads summer camp.

Why this matters: There have been studies and research on the effects of summer camp on faith formation for children and teens. In the book: "Cultivating Teen Faith: Insight from the Confirmation Project" by Osmer and Douglass 2018, the third chapter is dedicated to camp. It's entitled "Deep Rhythms of Faith Formation: Separation and Reintegration in Summer Camp and Retreats. "...the deeply immersive and experiential learning opportunities common at camps...are incredibly effective as catalysts for faith formation and environments for Christian education...Christian summer camp experiences were among the most consistently effective discipleship program revealed in our study...[Study showed] Campers showed significant growth during the camp experience in cognitive belief, perception of faith relevance, and self-confidence, with much of the growth persisting months after the camp."

For the rest of the Easter Season, the stories the children have heard about Jesus sharing with the disciples before the crucifixion, now take on a powerful new value. Jesus has become the "Good Shepherd" and appears before his disciples, and asks them to spread the message of "forgiveness". And so, in Eastertide we celebrate the wonder and prepare ourselves to take the message out into the world on Pentecost. *"Peace be with you,"* Jesus says. The disciples are now to carry on the work Jesus had begun. As God sent Jesus, now the disciples are sent out. Their message is handed on to us, the torch of peace, so we can use it in our everyday lives and hand it on to those who come after us.

Loving Jesus, help us to forgive people when they do things that hurt us or make us angry. Help us to learn to forgive like you forgive us.
