We are smack dab in the middle of one of my favorite liturgical seasons. And this year we are able to dwell in all 8 weeks of it because Easter is "late" this year. our history and gaze into the mirror. What are the ways society discriminated, and where is the system, and our actions continuing to oppress Blacks and other people who are different. We must be like the Christ-light that shines God's invitation, forgiveness and Love, welcomes all in a reconciling embrace. We are called to break down the systems of oppression that hinder the flourishing of the whole community. To more deeply understand, I hope to make a pilgrimage to The National Memorial for Peace and Justice, informally known as the National Lynching Memorial, built by the Equal Justice Initiative in Montgomery, Alabama. Maybe some of you will join me.

February is also a time to learn about and celebrate the accomplishments of Black Americans in spite of the obstacles society created to separate and obstruct. As Jesus crossed boundaries and ate with the people some called outcasts, we, too, can follow Jesus and love all of our neighbors as ourselves. Being inspired by the images and signs of Epiphany, we can participate in the Way of Love by living out the prayer for the whole human family: "O God, you made us in your own image and redeemed us through Jesus your Son: Look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; unite us in bonds of love; and work through our struggle and confusion to accomplish your purposes on earth; that, in your good time, all nations and races may serve you in harmony around your heavenly throne; through Jesus Christ our Lord." Amen (I'm in!). (BCP, 815)

Epiphany is the season of light for through Christ light has come into the world. May we awaken to a new awareness of how God is calling us to be Light and Love. Let us go forth and shine with the love of the Spirit! Alleluia!!

#### **Episcopal Church Women 2019 Film Fest**

The theme of St. John's 2019 ECW film and book season is a continuation of our 2018 theme "Discrimination and the Christian Response". Last year our discussions were based on Mark 12:31: "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." This year we are taking it a step further with Philippians 2:3b: "In humility, consider others better than yourselves." These verses provide a compass for following Jesus and spreading God's love in our world. This is always easier said than done, of course. We will use these verses as a basis for discussing the complexities of our spiritual journeys. All parish women and friends are invited to attend.

We will meet on Monday, February 4, at 7:00 PM in the downstairs lounge/vesting room to view and discuss The Man Who Knew Infinity starring Dev Patel and Jeremy Irons. A 2015 British film, based on a 1991 biography by Robert Kanigel, the film dramatizes the story of Srinivas Ramanujan, a poverty-stricken mathematician from India. While performing menial jobs, his college-educated employers realize that he has exceptional mathematical skills. Coming to the attention of Professor G. H. Hardy, he earns admittance to Cambridge University during World War I. The film was featured in international film festivals in Toronto, Zurich, Singapore, and Dubai.

The season of Epiphany continues through the month of February until Ash Wednesday, March 6th. Church School class lessons will still focus on the mission of the church to the world in light of the Nativity. The last Sunday of Epiphany, March 3rd, is celebrated as Transfiguration Sunday. The Gospel passage is most prominent, as it gives the account of Jesus' Transfiguration before Peter, James, and John high up on a mountain. In that moment, the three disciples are confronted by the glory of Jesus. They see Elijah and Moses, and they are at first bewildered. After hearing the voice of God they are terrified. The Transfiguration of Jesus is a moment at which the divinity and glory of Jesus are put on display, and Transfiguration Sunday seeks to capture this moment, while at the same time preparing us for the journey we are about to embark upon during the season of Lent.
